So, I would vote in favor of a proposal that the last two weeks of the season be set aside for playoffs between four teams. We have three teams who are more than 40 games behind and who have winning percentages at or below .331. We even have one team with a winning percentage of .143 and 62 games out of first, undoubtedly the worst in league history (sorry Scott!) In real baseball, the worst team has a winning percentage of .347 and is 33 games out of first.

Let me suggest that the Roto 7 format is directly responsible for this disparity. Because the format gives false hope to mediocre teams like the Monsters, there have been more buyers in the market for high priced players than there would be under the old rules. As a consequence, the lowest teams have been completely picked clean. And the richest teams have gotten very rich.

Further, but for the scoring revisions this year, the disparities would likely be even greater!

It's beginning to really look like the magical run of Derrick Turnbow is coming to an end. We can make excuses that his early struggles were due to minor mechanical problems. With more than half the games in the books, Turnbow is getting worse, not better. He now has seven blown saves after recording just four last season. His Ratio last season was a surprising 1.09. Surprising because he's never shown that kind

of control and command before. So you could expect some slippage this year, but not to the tune of 1.51 so far. That's far too many baserunners for a closer. One area he hasn't struggled is holding inherited runners on base. He's allowed just one in thirteen to score. So are his woes in 2006 related to command and control issues like the Brewers say, or is he hiding an injury? If we look to his K/9 rate, we get a positive sign -- 11.31. Last year it was 8.55. The high strikeout rate is supported by scouting reports that indicate his velocity is still there. We can eliminate arm strength issues at this point.

The fact that he's walked 23 (after 24 last season) signals that control is a problem. Turnbow has duplicated his home runs allowed for last season, and he has a little more than two months left in the 2006 season. Opposing batters are hitting .254 after mustering just a .199 clip last season.

It's hard to link Turnbow's problems to his health. While there could be a shoulder or elbow problem, it's unlikely. However, if you look at his career in its entirety, he was always considered a hard throwing right-hander without enough pitches to be a starter. Plus, he always seemed to struggle with command and control issues. Sound familiar? His 2005 season is looking more like an aberration and 2006 moving back to his career normal. This isn't to say he can't regain some of his 2005 form. However, we shouldn't be surprised by his struggles this season.

The Cardinals will be without their ace for at least one start while his sore shoulder is being checked out. Brian Walton of The Birdhouse on the Scout.com network did some excellent research on the injury.

"Carpenter will miss the start due to "scapulothoracic bursitis". While the depth of Carpenter's condition has not been fully shared at this time, here is some general information about the malady. Pain is caused by changes in bone or soft tissue between the scapula (shoulder blade) and the chest wall. Physicians recommend early, aggressive, conservative therapy for scapulothoracic bursitis in the throwing athlete, including rest, shoulder exercises, anti-inflammatory medications, and cortisone injections. However, arthroscopic surgery has proven to be required in some cases. This is not generally considered to be career-threatening."

The Cardinals can ill afford to lose Carpenter, who has certainly had his fair share of injuries in his career (labrum surgery in 2002, scar tissue surgery in 2003 and a nerve problem in 2004) for a long stretch. If the medical staff caught the ailment in time, the combination of medication and treatment should be enough to clear up the bursitis in the short term.
